

## A Message from the Chairman

Greetings in the Name of Jesus Christ!



I first shared the desire God had placed on my heart of starting a program to address the ravages of alcohol and drug addiction with my father and our late pastor, Rev. Cameron Alexander, in 1988. What is now Antioch Urban Ministries, Inc. was birthed from that vision. It has expanded far beyond the initial program that Rev. Rodney K. Turner, currently pastor of Mt. Vernon Baptist Church, and I designed because the needs are so great.

As I drive through the city of Atlanta, and especially through the neighborhood where Antioch Baptist Church North is located, Jesus's statement about the poor is readily visible. Tomorrow is Palm Sunday, and three gospels record the account of the woman washing Jesus's feet with her tears, wiping them with her hair, and then applying expensive perfume to them as occurring during what we now call Holy Week. In response to comments about the costliness of the perfume with which the woman anoints his feet, he tells the disciples that the poor will always be among them, but the time of his earthly presence is short. The account in Mark 14:7 includes the reason AUMI continues to help those who are in need. 7 The poor you will always have with you, and you can help them any time you want. But you will not always have me (NIV).

"The poor" certainly means those who are lacking basic necessities, and that is why we continue our Food and Clothing Banks. But we must interpret the words of Jesus in light of other scripture. In the Beatitudes, he says, "blessed are the poor in spirit" (Matthew 5:3). Each of us has been spiritually poor, sinners who could not save ourselves. Some of us realized early in our lives that the only way to end our spiritual destitution was to put our faith and trust in Jesus Christ. Others tried to fill the void in destructive ways before coming to the end of themselves. AUMI has stood in the gap as a bridge between the end of self and the beginning with Jesus. All of our programs provide a spiritual foundation into which other services and therapies are woven to address the individual needs of our participants.

As we celebrate my consecration as pastor, I continue to dedicate myself to reach out to the least, the less and the loss. The time I want to help alleviate hurt and pain in whatever form it takes is always now. I thank my Antioch family for continuing to support my vision.

The Reverend Kenneth Lamont Alexander, a resolute man of God, serves as the Pastor of the historic Antioch Baptist Church North. He is the son of the Reverend Dr. Cameron M. Alexander who served as pastor for more than 49 years, and Dr. Barbara J. Alexander who anchored their family and was a dynamic source of inspiration for the entire Antioch Congregation.

Reverend Alexander, affectionately known at Antioch as Reverend Kenny, is a third-generation Baptist preacher and was licensed and ordained at the Antioch Baptist Church North. His powerful voice and servant leadership skills were cultivated, honed and nurtured at Antioch where he has served as the President of the Minister's Alliance, Presiding Minister of the Antioch Lakewood Mission for more than 20 years and the Assistant to the Pastor.

With strength, courage and transparency, Reverend Alexander is steadfast in his commitment to addressing some of life's most pressing challenges. Through his preaching, teaching and counseling, he offers God's message of hope, encouragement and redemption to all of God's people. Pivotal to his discipleship is uplifting those who are all too often counted among the least, the less and the lost. He demonstrates his conviction to God's calling through his perseverance, tenacity and zeal with which he carries out God's directives given in the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20).

Reverend Alexander is the Chairman of the Board of Directors of Antioch Urban Ministries, Inc. (AUMI). AUMI serves as an advocacy agent providing essential supports to families in need and comprehensive substance abuse recovery services. The AUMI Food Bank provides for over 300 families each week through collaboration with the Atlanta Community Food Bank. The Clothing Bank distributes donated apparel, toiletries, shoes and other necessities to men, women and children. Annual Back-to-School and Christmas outreach efforts support the needs of hundreds of Atlanta children.

For over 25 years, Reverend Alexander has ensured that AUMI provides holistic support for the needs of those living with the complex and chronic conditions of alcohol and drug addictions. He is fiercely committed to maintaining a full complement of ministries that foster sustained substance abuse recovery with efficacy, respect and dignity. The AUMI recovery ministries include the Ananias House; Luke's Place; Billups' and Job's Place (for men in recovery); Ruth's Place and Lydia's House (for women in recovery); Matthew's Place (for persons living with HIV) and the Land of Promise Christian Home (an affiliate of the General Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia, Inc).

Through his dedication to these supportive ministries, Reverend Alexander has helped more than 7,000 men and women to rebuild family relationships, become self-sufficient and sustain their sobriety.

Reverend Alexander's efforts, outcomes and accomplishments have not gone unnoticed. He has received recognition and accolades from a multitude of esteemed organizations, including the Concerned Black Clergy's Man of the Year Award. The Rainbow PUSH Coalition presented him with its God's Trombone Award for Excellent Service and Outstanding Achievement. He also received an Award from the Argosy University for Outstanding Leadership and Scholastic Ability. Atlanta Metropolitan State College acknowledged Reverend Alexander's outstanding community leadership with its Celebration of Leadership Award. He has served the National Baptist Convention USA, Inc. as a member of the Presidential Qualifications Committee and has been a Devotional Speaker during the Convention's Annual Session. He currently serves on the Boards of Directors for the Morehouse School of Religion and the Westside Future Funds. As a testament to Reverend Alexander's continuous efforts to support and assist the least of these in Atlanta's historic Westside neighborhoods, AUMI became a part of the Beloved Community sponsored, in part, by the Chick Fil-A Foundation.

An inherent leader and proficient scholar, Reverend Alexander is a graduate of the Atlanta Public School System where he was president of his senior class at Southwest High School. He attended Florida A&M University where he pledged Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity and served as the organization's Fund-Raising Chair. Reverend Alexander graduated from Morehouse College with a Bachelor's degree in Psychology and from Argosy University with a Master's degree in Industrial Organizational Psychology.

However, for Reverend Alexander, his most noteworthy achievement happened on a Thursday night during a Revival meeting at Antioch Baptist Church North when he accepted Jesus Christ as his personal Savior.

Reverend Alexander has been married to Lisa Kathleen Gilbert since 1985. God blessed them with two wonderful daughters, Kathleen Nicole (deceased) and Ashley Lauren, and three cherished grandsons—DeMario, Deigo, and Daylin.

## Our Father's Business

#### THE HISTORY OF ANTIOCH URBAN MINISTRIES, INC.

This afternoon, the Board of Directors and the members of Antioch Baptist Church North gather to celebrate Rev. Kenneth L. Alexander and the remarkable leadership that he will provide in serving as Pastor of Antioch Baptist Church North and current Chairman of Antioch Urban Ministries, Inc., otherwise known as AUMI.

AUMI was incorporated in 1992 as a non-profit charitable organization to serve as an advocacy agent to address the social needs of the poor, the under-served and the disadvantaged in neighborhoods surrounding the Antioch Church campus. The outreach and systemic work of AUMI, especially its housing programs for the homeless and the working poor, have endeared AUMI as a "best in class" social service organization addressing the immediate needs of impoverished people within the city of Atlanta.

The seed for AUMI was first planted in 1988 by Reverend Kenneth Alexander when he shared with his father, Dr. Cameron M. Alexander, his personal dream of Antioch providing a "safe haven" ministry to address the holistic needs of persons suffering from drug and alcohol addictions. Realizing the havoc and devastating impact that drug abuse was having within the black community, and especially upon the neighborhoods that immediately surrounded the Antioch Church campus, Dr. Alexander challenged Rev. Kenneth Alexander and Rev. Rodney K. Turner, who were both Antioch staff members at that time, to design a Christian-based substance abuse recovery program with measurable metrics to define participant success.

The initial program established by Rev. Kenneth Alexander and Rev. Rodney Turner was called FREAD (Free to Recover from the Evils of Alcohol and Drugs). The central component of the early program was a dedicated telephone number where persons suffering from drug addiction could call anytime (day or night) to discuss the perils of their addiction. The telephone line staff offered confidential counseling, prayer, and referrals for support. That hope-line ministry quickly informed the two novice leaders that a definite need existed for the FREAD Ministry and a place was also needed where addicts from the community could come for help and group counseling.

Dr. Alexander established Ananias' House, under the watchful eye of the Church's Human Resources Department, as a 24-hour residential treatment center for men recovering from chemical dependencies. It was located next to the church in a very modest house that had been acquired as a part of the Antioch acquisitions program for a new worship center. Dr. Alexander was in a unique position to interact and gain firsthand experience of the acute needs of men with alcohol and drug addictions as they came to the Ananias House for help.

During the late 1980s, the City of Atlanta found itself challenged by an avalanche of problems surrounding housing and services for its working homeless population. There existed a very strained and uncomfortable relationship between the homeless advocates and the Mayor's Office, which resulted in the takeover of the downtown Imperial Hotel. To remedy the problem, Mayor Maynard Jackson asked Rev. C. M. Alexander to serve as mediator between the homeless people, the homeless advocates and the Mayor's Administration. Rev. Alexander directed Joe Beasley, who served as the Church's Human Resources Director, to engage all parties involved to help find solutions to the problem.

Months of very vocal, sensitive meetings with civic and political leaders and the faith community were conducted to negotiate a remedy for the growing tensions of the downtown homeless issue. A major partnership was forged between Progressive Redevelopment, Inc. and the City of Atlanta, with Antioch serving as the peace broker, leading to the purchase of the Walton Hotel. It was envisioned that the Walton would be converted into a single-room occupancy facility to provide much needed housing for the City's homeless and working poor.

Dr. Alexander convened a group of church members with diverse backgrounds and professional experiences to develop a program that would serve the homeless, special-needs populations, and the working poor. This newly formed group was subsequently named and incorporated as Antioch Urban Ministries, Inc. (AUMI) in April 1992. Joe Beasley was appointed to serve as AUMI's first Executive Director, a position he held for more than ten years.

The founding board members were: Rev. Cameron M. Alexander, William Harding, Joseph Beasley, Naomi Floyd, Linda Harper, Nathaniel Johnson, III, Bob Jones, Ed London, James McTerry, Evelyn Roberts, Shirley McCrary-Simmons, Don Speaks, Margaret Weaver, Elyria Mackie, Timothye Bowie, James Dixon, Curtis Hines, and Garry Mott. The group elected the following officers: Rev. Cameron M. Alexander, Chair; William Harding, Vice Chair; Evelyn Roberts, Secretary; Gary Mott, Treasurer; Elyria Mackie, Financial Secretary; and Naomi Floyd, Assistant Financial Secretary.

Shortly after the establishment of Antioch Urban Ministries, Inc. (AUMI), some of the human service activities and programs of Antioch Baptist Church North were reprogrammed and transferred under the AUMI umbrella. In addition to its meaningful work with the Madison House, AUMI has provided other housing opportunities and a variety of supportive social services to more than 20,000 individuals and families through the following programs:

#### Ruth's Place

A transitional housing facility for women in recovery, Ruth's Place provides housing and meals. The women focus on understanding themselves by participating in support groups, life skills training, community service through the AUMI Food Bank, financial literacy and other spiritual enrichment opportunities. After residency, they are prepared to re-enter the work force, reconnect with their families and begin a productive lifestyle free from substance abuse based on the skill sets provided during their tenure within the program.

#### Luke's Place

A 10- bed Christian substance abuse recovery home, Luke's Place provides housing, meals, support groups, spiritual enrichment opportunities, and other supportive services for men in recovery. These life skill experiences, coupled with vocational training, prepare participants for re-entry into the work place, reconnection with their families and a productive lifestyle free from substance abuse based on the skill sets provided during their tenure within the program.

#### Malachi Ministry

A youth-at-risk program that provides life-skills training for youth ages 7 - 17 years of age. Malachi specifically serves young men within the 5th Ward area. This area includes English Avenue, Joseph E. Boone Boulevard, and Hollowell Parkway. The program offers a rewarding path to effective and manageable service to children at risk.

#### Matthew's Place

A program that provides housing and supportive services for persons living with HIV and/or AIDS, Matthew's Place participants enjoy comfortable living in a single-room occupancy environment and have the benefit of supportive services offered by AUMI. Through a strong partnership and funding from the City of Atlanta, Matthew's Place continues to transform the lives of disenfranchised people.

#### AUMI Food/Clothing Bank

Individuals within the Atlanta metropolitan area are provided food on weekly basis. Currently, we provide food for more than 350 families per week, 100 seniors on a monthly basis and distribute 10,000 lbs. of produce on a weekly basis for persons over 55. In addition to providing food to those in need within our community, AUMI provides food for more than 35 students attending Atlanta Metropolitan State College on a bi-weekly basis. We continue to provide basic essentials such as clothing and other household goods to members of the community on a weekly basis as well.

AUMI manages an extraordinary Human Services Outreach component which includes a Prison Ministry, a Recovery Support Group, membership in the THOR Directory for the State of Georgia's Department of Community Services, and an HIV/AIDS Prevention Education Program. Through its dynamic network of viable collaborations, the work of AUMI has been maximized by partnerships with the Atlanta Workforce Development Corporation, Northyards Business Park, West End Medical Services, Georgia Department of Community Services, General Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia, Land of Promise Christian Recovery Home, Atlanta Metropolitan State College Work Study Program, Westside Momentum, Atlanta Community Food Bank, Westside Future Fund, and as a recipient of the Beacon Award from the Beloved Community, a part of the Beloved Benefit in conjunction with the Chick Fil A Foundation

Antioch Urban Ministries, Inc. continues to play a vital role in the City of Atlanta, especially in the English Avenue Community. Today, AUMI substance abuse and AIDS ministries provide housing and support services (i.e. housing, including food and clothing) to more than 50 persons annually. The AUMI Food Bank provided more than one million pounds of food in 2018. AUMI continues to provide assistance for victims of natural disasters, like the hurricanes that devastated parts of Texas, Florida, Savannah and Atlanta. These efforts included our participation in sending a truckload of disaster relief items for those affected by the storms within the southeast region, specifically Louisiana and Texas. During the Federal Government Shutdown, AUMI, along with Antioch Baptist Church, provided food and other necessities for those employees affected by the shutdown.

The AUMI mission to those in need remains the embodiment of its illustrious Chairman, whose "servant heart and leader-ship" lives and teaches the mandates prescribed in Matthew 25:35-40. Dr. Cameron M. Alexander's visionary leadership was coupled with the resilience, transparency, passion and intelligence of our new Chairman, the Rev. Kenneth L. Alexander. He maintains the integrity and core values of AUMI as he seeks to bring the ministries prescribed in the Matthew passage to fruition by transforming the lives of those who seek and secure the services of Antioch Urban Ministries, Inc. (AUMI).

## A Message from the Pastor

Greetings in the Name of Jesus Christ!



As we begin a new chapter in the history of our church, I am blessed to call Antioch Baptist Church North my church home for almost fifty years. I am beyond humbled at the memory of my family relocating to Atlanta when my father, Rev. Dr. Cameron Madison Alexander, was called to the pastorate of this great church. My childhood years are filled with fond memories and reflections of the Antioch congregation—vibrant, energetic and full of the Holy Ghost. Extending beyond our Spiritfilled worship services from devotion to the benediction, I was privileged to witness the legacy of my Father and our pastor unfold. Growing up, I witnessed Pastor Alexander preach the Word on Sundays, teach the Word on Wednesdays and drive the Blue Bird Bus to pick up the youth on Saturdays. Hermon Association. Our pastor also had a willingness to share his pastoral teachings, and as a result, there are more than 150 pastoring Sons across the Country.

Never forgetting the least of these, our pastor taught our congregation to fulfill the mandate set by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in Matthew 25. Antioch is well known for feeding the hungry, giving water to the thirsty, clothing the naked, taking in strangers and visiting the sick and imprisoned. Our religious affiliations reach far and wide because Dr. Cameron M. Alexander exposed our congregation to the great preachers of the day: Dr. C.A.W. Clark, Dr. E.V. Hill, Dr. A. Louis Patterson, and so many others.

Our influence in the community extends beyond Fifth Ward community. Antioch Baptist Church North is recognized as a champion for social justice. Our congregation was impacted by Civil Rights legends such Dr. Ralph Abernathy, Ambassador Andrew Young, Dr. C. T. Vivian, Congressman John Lewis, Dr. Joseph Lowery, Xernona Clayton, Coretta Scott King, Juanita Abernathy, Rev. Jesse Jackson, Nelson Mandela and Bishop Desmond Tutu—just to name a few.

From singing in choirs two and three to the youth usher board to the security ministry—to president of the Minister's Alliance, Antioch raised me. 


Sunrise - July 10, 1986 • Sunset - September 10, 2017





## Reverend Dr. Rodney K. Turner



Reverend Rodney Kirk Turner was born in Atlanta, Georgia. He is the son of Rufus and Betty Turner. He is a product of the Atlanta Public School system and a graduate of the Frederick Douglas High School class of 1975. Rev. Turner obtained his college education at the Historic Morehouse College as a sociology and criminology major. While pursuing his education at Morehouse, Rev. Turner became a member of Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity and served as president for two years. He furthered his biblical education at Carver and Beulah Heights Bible Colleges. In May 2015, Rev. Turner received an Honorary Doctorate of Divinity from Carver College for his twenty-nine years of service work in the field of substance abuse and outreach ministry throughout the State of Georgia and across the country. For nine plus years, Rev. Turner served as Pastor of Canaan Missionary Baptist Church in Roanoke, Alabama and is presently entering his sixteenth year as Pastor and undershepherd of the Mount Vernon Baptist Church in Atlanta, Georgia. He is a proud father and a loving husband to former State Representative LaNett L. Stanley of Atlanta, GA.

Rev. Turner was licensed to preach in February 1990 and ordained in January 1995 at the Antioch Baptist Church North in Atlanta, Georgia by the Rev. Dr. C. M. Alexander, Pastor of the Antioch Baptist Church North and President Emeritus of the General Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia, Inc. While attending Antioch, Rev. Turner served as an associate minister and worked on the staff of Antioch for over seventeen plus years as Antioch's Substance Abuse, AIDS, Prison Ministry and Outreach Coordinator. He was the director of Antioch's first recovery residence for men, the Ananias House and Antioch's first recovery residence for women, Ruth's Place. Rev. Turner is the Founder of one of the nation's most successful recovery ministries, Product of the Power Ministry, a Christian-based recovery ministry that addresses the needs of those suffering with substance abuse issues and other spiritual behavioral disorders. He has authored six books that address how to overcome sin and addiction from a biblical perspective. Many churches across denominational lines and other Christian organizations around the nation seeking to start a Christian-based recovery ministry or program use Rev. Turner's seven-step model and materials from his books on Christian recovery as their model for recovery ministry.

Rev. Turner has served on the Governor's AIDS Task force, the SCLC Wings of Hope Anti-Drug Taskforce, the Fulton County Street Team and was chosen by Armac to participate in a one-year internship at Atlanta West Drug and Alcohol Treatment Center and Methadone Clinic. Rev. Turner has taught recovery classes in the urban ministries department at Beulah Heights Bible College and has served as a faculty member of the National Baptist Congress of Christian Education, Auxiliary to the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc. Rev. Turner served for twenty-four years as a faculty member of the General Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia, Congress of Christian Education, where he taught and lectured on Christian based recovery. He has served as lead columnist for the nationally published magazine Recovery Solutions.

Rev. Turner was a consultant and life skills counselor for twenty-four years with Clark Atlanta University and the Fulton County Judicial system as the senior counselor for Project Redirection, a special program designed to provide alternatives to incarceration for Fulton County non-violent offenders. In addition, he has worked with Juvenile offenders in DeKalb, Cobb and Fulton Counties through Project Redirection's youth initiatives. He has served as a chaplain for the Fulton County Jail Division for over twenty years and is a member of the Georgia Sheriff Association Chaplain's Division.

Rev. Turner was a 2017 Inductee into the Morehouse College Martin Luther King Jr. Board of Preachers. He currently serves as a board member for Antioch Urban Ministries. Rev. Turner has received several awards including the 2000 Atlanta Dairy Association's Movers and Shakers Award, the 2002 Antioch Baptist Church North's Man of The Year and Community Service Award, the 2004 Antioch Urban Ministries Mighty Faith Award, the 2005 Concerned Black Clergy's Community Service Award, the 2006 Gospel Choice Chosen Award and the 2012 God's Trombone Award from Rainbow PUSH. In 2015, Rev. Turner was recognized by the Apex Museum for his work in the field of recovery and outreach ministry. In 2017, he received the President Barack Obama's Lifetime Achievement Award for National and Community Service.

With over thirty years of Christ-centered recovery work and outreach initiatives, Rev. Turner has helped countless men and women turn their lives around through a right functioning relationship with Jesus Christ. He is a leader and advocate for the disadvantaged, the hungry and the homeless in the community, always sharing the good news of Jesus Christ. Rev. Turner's motto is, "Therefore, if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature, old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new," 2nd Corinthians 5:17.

































## CONSECRATION
