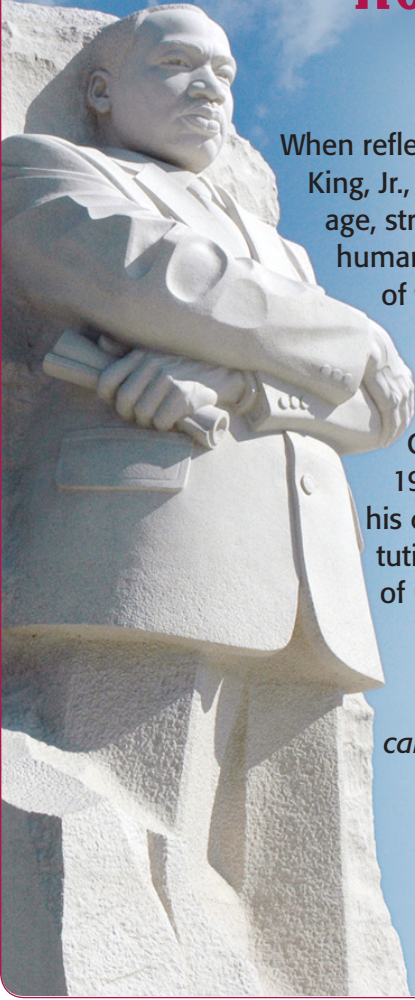
WOMANHOOD MINISTRY

HONORING THE LEGACY OF DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.



When reflecting on the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., certain words come to mind - leadership, courage, strength, integrity, sacrifice, all character traits of a humanitarian serving humankind. From his pastorate of the Dexter Avenue Baptist Church in Montgomery, AL to his successful effort to desegregate buses in Montgomery, AL, and the founding and serving as first president of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, to his death in 1968, Dr. King led a life of service and sacrifice to his death on April 4, 1968. In challenging the institutionalized system of inequality, he challenged all of us to live up to a higher standard – one of love, compassion, fairness, and integrity.

MLK DAY OF SERVICE

Preaching from Ebenezer’s pulpit on February 4th, 1968, Dr. King stated, “If you want to be great, wonderful, but recognize that he who is greatest among you will be a servant... You don’t have to have a college degree to serve... You only need a heart full of grace and a soul generated by love. You can be that servant.”

On **Monday, January 15, 2018**, we will celebrate the life and achievements of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. with a day of service. Antioch has identified a few opportunities for our church family to serve in the very communities where Dr. King fought for civil rights and racial equality.
